




THE PANDEMIC KEEPS SHAKING YOUTH WORK TO THE CORE

These values have increased slightly over time (+4%, spring 2020 vs autumn 2020).



"Our budget has been cut in half. New funding is entirely uncertain. The financial impact is hitting us very hard at the moment."




"The economic effects of the crisis have undermined our financial stability. We had to cut wages and reduce staff to be able to cope."

"It is those young people we care most about in our daily work that we cannot get in touch with anymore. They have almost completely disappeared from our work. I am worried."





Q: In your opinion and context, how well has *youth work* as a field responded to the crisis so far?








YOUTH WORK KEEPS HELPING MANY YOUNG PEOPLE TO NAVIGATE THE CRISIS

Q: Has your involvement in youth work helped you during these times?









THE SUPPORT OF YOUTH WORK NEEDS FAST AND VAST IMPROVEMENTS

Q. In your opinion and context, how well has youth work as a field been supported during the crisis so far by...?







