RAY-PART: Basic designs of researched projects

- Empowering specific target groups to actively take part in civil society
- Simulating political participation
- Working on/exploring a topic related to participation and citizenship
- Practising participation in civil society
- Development and implementation of project concepts fostering participation and citizenship

RAY-LTE/PART: Ways of learning

- Participatory learning (Involvement of participants)
- Experiential learning/Learning by doing
- Peer learning/Learning from and with others
- Learning in groups – Individual learning

RAY-PART: Educational approaches and important key elements

- Non-formal and informal (formal learning)
- Learner-centred
- Teambuilding
- Trustful relationship through appreciative atmosphere and transparency

- Preparation
- Guidance
- Follow-up/Dissemination
- Further project participation

In European youth programmes participation and citizenship are promoted through non-formal settings, methods and forms of learning, more or less like other goals of European youth programs. However, it seems to be decisive that fostering participation and citizenship is an explicit aim of the project, that this aim is explicitly communicated to the participants/ the connection of the project topic with participation and citizenship is illustrated and that the terms are named and explained.
